




Miracle Spice of Meghalaya

A spice revolution unfurls in the Jaintia Hills; the birthplace of the world's finest variety of Turmeric



The tiny nondescript at the foothills of Meghalaya, i.e. West Jaintia Hills is the heartland of a silent revolution. West Jaintia Hills Districts of Meghalaya is home to one of the finest and oldest turmeric varieties in the world – the famous "Lakadong" variety. It has the highest curcumin content, ranging between – 6.5 to 7.5 % (ICAR testing report) as against 2 to 3% found in regular varieties available in the market. Globally, the said curcumin content is the highest among turmeric growing nations (Vietnam – 5-5.5%, Indonesia 4-5% etc.)¹.



Fun fact



Did you know that Jaintia Hills' Trinity Saioo, a champion of Meghalaya's Lakadong turmeric, was awarded the Padma Shri in 2021 for mobilising up to 800 farmers from Mulieh village to form self-help organisations to cultivate the native spice and strengthen the local economy? She is a school teacher by trade and was instrumental in convincing the state government to start the "Lakadong Turmeric Mission," which aims to increase the production of local turmeric.

Health Benefits

Lakadong is popular for its highest curcumin content and manufacturing of anti-cancer curcumin tablets, oleoresins, essential oils, culinary purposes, and other uses in cosmetic, pharmaceutical and food industry. According to Nutrition Business Journal Report, turmeric is one of the fastest growing dietary supplements which recorded sevenfold increase in demand in the last decade. The increase in consumption is led by the upsurge in demand from pharma (anti-cancer tablets, treatment of Alzheimer's etc) and food industry.



- Curcumin is fat soluble, it breaks down and dissolves in fat or oil, with dosages usually 1 gram per day.
- Chronic low-level inflammation can play a role in some health conditions and diseases such as heart disease, cancer, metabolic syndrome, Alzheimer's disease and various degenerative conditions

Heart Health


 Curcumin has beneficial effects on several factors known to play a role in heart disease.
 Plus, it's an antiinflammatory agent and antioxidant.

Bone Health

 Arthritis is a common disorder characterized by joint inflammation.
 Curcumin can help treat symptoms of arthritis and is, in some cases, more effective than antiinflammatory drugs. It breaks down collagen and causing abnormalities in elastin, leading to thinner skin and wrinkles causing even pigmented patches.


